Minutes of 66th committee meeting held on Friday 14th May in Biochemical Society.

82/11 Apologies for absence were received from Dr. H.C. Watson and for lateness from Dr. Phelps.

82/12 The Minutes of the 65th meeting were accepted with correction of Professor B.R. Jenning's initials.

83/13 Matters Arising:

- (a) Dr. Lillford's report on the Biophysics Discussion Group was received and was to form an appendix to the minutes. The Meeting's Secretary was to be jointly (but not executively) responsible for the Group's activities.
- (b) Dr. Bayley reported progress in the setting up of the European Biophysical Societies Association with draft constitution expected by the end of 1982. He received agreement for the immediate submission of our 500,00DM contribution.
- (c) Dr. Phelps reported on the large number of Biophysics Courses which had been deleted from his list. Data on this would be available for the next meeting and a submission drafted for member's circulation on this problem. In conjunction with this, the British National Committee on Biophysics would be asked to take up the matter although it appeared to be outside the area in which they have operated in until now.
- (d) Dr. Bayley was asked to list the data obtained on member's interests and reported on the problems of Analysis.
- (e) The Treasurer recommended no change in the subscription level.
- (f) The Secretary would look into the matter of Honorary members for the next meeting.
